


- To protect and promote the Lithuanian language;





OLD


- Leadership is a rare skill;

NEW

- Many people have leadership skills;
- Leadership skills can be developed;
- Some leaders are quiet and effective;
- Leadership exists at all levels of the association;
- Leaders encourages, listens; and develops;
