We are planning for the Congress and the Conference to be a face-to-face event and we remain hopeful that this will be possible.

The theme of the event, Language education in the times of global change: The need for collaboration and new perspectives, is indeed fitting as it reflects the unprecedented challenges and difficulties that we have had to confront and adjust to in all aspects of our lives as a result of the pandemic, including language education, which for the most part has had to rely on online resources and new technologies.

The Congress will represent a unique opportunity to meet language educators from across the globe and to discuss a wide variety of issues involved in the teaching and learning of second and foreign languages.
